#### 2020 – A Year of New Vision

"Let anyone who is thirsty come to me, and let the one who believes in me drink.

As the scripture has said, 'Out of the believer's heart shall flow rivers of living water.'"

— Jesus (John 7:37–38)

Vision 20/20 in 2020 is a catchy phrase. However, clarity of vision in life and for a congregation takes time to form while intentionally walking with God. The inner life of each of us is gradually shaped by everything and everyone we spend time with. Most of us are completely unaware of this formation process. When we do become aware of issues in the way we've been formed (for example, a struggle with anger, pride, or insecurity), we often don't know how the problem developed, or what we can do about it.

The good news is that there is something we can do about who we are now, and about who we are becoming. An awareness of our own formation will allow us to become more intentional about what — and who — we let shape us. As followers of Jesus, we want to pour out our lives for others. This is a good and beautiful thing. However, if we are not continually replenished by "living water," we will end up drained, dry, and exhausted.

Jesus showed us what it means to be fully alive, living in intimate connection with the Father, serving in God's power. We're invited into that kind of life — life in the Kingdom of Heaven — right here and now.



One tool I'd like to share and discuss together in the coming year is <u>Partnering with the King</u> by John Hiigel. The author of Partnering with the King is Professor of Biblical Studies at the University of Sioux Falls in South Dakota. For newcomers to faith, the book can serve as an introduction to the Christian life. For more seasoned Christians, it will be a source of renewal and vision. This resource follows Matthew's gospel, coordinating with the readings assigned for Sunday morning this year.

I'd like to read the book together as members of New Hope and study it together. I don't have a chosen time in mind to meet together. I'd like to work that detail out with those who would like to study it together. Please let me know if you would like to join this study -- sign up on the bulletin board at church as soon as possible.

I imagine it will take us about 7 months to cover the material, meeting once a month, along with reading the entirety of the gospel of Matthew. I hope you will join together with other members of our family of faith to talk about the way your life and our life together may be shaped by God.

Together, may we walk closer to Jesus, and gain a vision that is closer to 20/20 in 2020.

#### Skipped Story on 12/29:

On December 29th I preached a sermon on Matthew 2:13-23 entitled, "Pursuing the King." King Herod was a popular king but he was the villain of the story in Matthew 2. He held onto his status in the ways the world always does - wealth and power. In his case, his desire to retain power included murderous actions toward children. Herod couldn't have been further from the vision God had for the world in the infant Jesus he sought to eliminate. This is how the world works: wealth, power, violence. We see it every day on the news. But God has cast a different vision – where God's people protect, serve, love, and care for the lowly and needy. I spoke of Christians being committed to God's vision of reality and serving those in need. In order to save time, I skipped the following story some of you requested:

Jesse Jackson tells about a visit he made to the University of Southern Mississippi. While touring the campus with the university president, he saw a towering male student, sixfeet, eightinches tall, holding hands with a fidgety coed barely threefeet tall. What a contrast, sixfeet, eight-inches tall and only threefeet tall. His curiosity piqued, Jackson watched as the young man, dressed in a warmup suit, tenderly kissed the tiny coed, and sent her off to class.

The president said that the student was a star basketball player. Both parents had passed away when he was a teenager, and he made a vow to look after his sister. Many scholarships came his way, but only Southern Mississippi offered one to his sister, too.

Jackson went over to the basketball star, introduced himself, and said he appreciated the way he was looking out for his sister. The athlete shrugged and said, "Those of us who 600God makes sixeight have to look out for those he makes threethree." And then I summarized the message:

We still live in Herod-filled world with values that do not match God's, but a new world is coming. You are invited into it, a world without oppression and death, and it begins now under the gentle and just rule of Jesus. May we make it our aim of pursuing a worthy king like Jesus.


#### Zelle Give Better With Mobil Banking

#### From the Deacon


Dear New Hope Friends,
