Hello family of faith at New Hope Lutheran Church,

Let me begin with a title, that evokes an image, which will lead us to a story. They are known as SHERPA's. These are the heavy lifters who help the hiking community ascend a variety of the world's tallest peaks. The recent Netflix movie called "14 Peaks" highlights the effort and raw will of Nimsdai Purja. Nimsdai set a goal to climb all of the world's peaks that exceed 8,000 meters or 26,246 feet. At that altitude air is thin, exhaustion is on the next breath, and annually out of each climbing team of 7 Sherpa's, one Sherpa will die on the slope. This is high risk. What made Nimsdai's effort unique is that he chose to accomplish this effort in a 7 month window where previously the record was 7 years.

It would mean that on many ascents you would be ascending and descending constantly during the day and all through the night. One set of 3 peaks were climbed in 2 days and 30 minutes. It was as if this set of climbers were jogging past other climbers coming and going.

In a word this is perseverance. The passionate effort to accomplish what others can hardly imagine. It is one foot after another, one day at a time, goals that are enormous but when divided into smaller bites, the end is attainable.

Perseverance.

In the religious community we call this faith. The determination, fortitude, and partnership to reach for that which we cannot yet imagine. In the Letter to the Hebrews the Apostle Paul writes, Hebrews 11:1 'Now faith is the confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we cannot see'. Perhaps we can begin to imagine ourselves as sherpas of the faith.

We pray.

Holy One, divine Sherpa, as you carry our lives, stir in us a sure and certain hope in your love, grace, mercy, and forgiveness.


