From Pastor Scott Maxwell-Doherty

We welcome Pastor Steve Simpson as presider and preacher this coming Sunday. Pastor Steve has a couple of Sunday's off and Deacon Lynn was able to convince him to come to New Hope. So you may wonder, "where is Pastor Scott on Feb. 27th?" Part of my call is 1/2 time. One of the ways I can make peace with a 1/2 time call is to be there for three Sundays in a row, two preaching Sundays and one as liturgist. The fourth Sunday of the month I will be absent, which means New Hope welcomes a guest preacher/presider. We are fortunate to have Pastor Steve so close and available. Thank you Pastor Steve.

Mask Mandates - It is clear to me that we are ALL wearied by the need to wear a mask. Wearied is one word... frustrated would be another. I am aligned with you in this.

It is also apparent that New Hope is a community that reaches out and 'touches' one another for the sake of community development. Are we breaking some 6 foot distancing protocol by L.A. County? Most certainly. Are we risking safety by "Sharing the Peace of Christ" during the liturgy. Most probably. Have we reduced our care for one another by being more present/close to one another? I suspect so. That said, I will keep before us the need to honor those who have remained separate from the community because of increased health risks. I will keep before us the need to protect the immune compromised when we gather as we continue to wear masks. I will, with you, long for the moment we can receive Holy Communion face to face without the 'peel and eat' variety.

What do I do at New Hope? Great question. Well first and foremost, I serve as your Interim Pastor. The list of responsibilities includes: Provide the Sacraments, Console the sick and suffering, Tend the families of those who have died, Preach and teach.

And then there are other duties which we would call Pastoral administration - Weekly I am reaching out to each member through email with an introductory note and word of encouragement. Weekly I am in touch with various members of our Church Council. Weekly I meet with the parish staff to calendar and plan. Weekly I look downstream at upcoming worship service to insure that we are ready. Weekly I take delight in the worship rehearsal.

I am glad to be among you. Thank you for welcoming me.

- Lenten midweek services will happen every Wednesday from March 9 to April 6, starting at 11 am. There will be a short worship service using Holden Evening Prayer, and we will lunch together (bring your own sack lunch) at 11:45. Services will not be livestreamed, but if there's interest we can have a "Zoom lunch table" for our time together.


