Truth

I remember like it was yesterday getting caught in a lie. My next door neighbor named Chuck needed a lot of assistance in riding a bike, throwing and catching, mowing a lawn, and printing that was legible. His dad traveled the world for Lockheed Space and Missiles and was frequently out of town. His mom thought he needed a 'male' figure to teach him some of the essential childhood elements. So, I did. We spent hours together, wondering, learning, drawing, painting, and riding a bike.

In one moment of confidence Chuck volunteered to be a LEAD in his elementary school play. Mind you this was a child with some learning disabilities, memory challenges, and verbal hiccups (his words). But, as he said to me, "Why not, what have I got to lose."

The day of the school play I was told where to go and when. I didn't. Why? It doesn't matter. There are no worthy excuses.

The next day his mom showed up to chat with me. She was a southern woman who had a drawl that exuded emotion. "You were not there," she said. I flailed about with "I couldn't get into the room," or "I missed the time," or "I got caught on the wrong day." I reeled off a hundred excuses. She said, "I'll hear none of this. You told my son you would be there and you were not. You owe him an apology."

She was right. I was wrong. I had been trapped in my lies.

From John 8:31 - "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

Years later, Chuck and I had a reckoning of the truth. The conversation was about what I had done, what he had hoped for, and what we wanted as an outcome. We agreed, and I confessed, that I had lied and screwed up. He acknowledged that he had hoped I would be there and was seriously disappointed and thus trust was broken.

And where are we now? He and I chat frequently, we remember often, we retell the child stories of pain and joy. What surfaces is that the TRUTH sets us free.

I encourage you to set TRUTH loose. Call it out. Own it. Embrace it....even as it is uncomfortable. The truth sets us free. Pastor Scott

It's been good to start celebrating New Hope/Westlake Lutheran Church's 50th anniversary as a congregation. Now there's a very important "Save the Date" to put on your calendar.

Our story started in 1970, when Pastor Bob Lawson was given the okay to start forming another Lutheran church in the Conejo Valley area.

By 1972 Westlake Lutheran Church had been formed officially, and Pastor Bob called as their first pastor. When putting together the timeline, we found two things:

- Our anniversary year ought to go from May of 2022 to April of 2023 to add in all the important dates of the founding of the congregation.
- Many of those famous firsts took place on the shore of the lake in Westlake Village.

After looking at all of this, it seemed fitting to plan our "big event" to close out our anniversary year so that it, too, would be lakeside. Mark your calendar now for **Sunday, April 23, 2023**, for a worship service and luncheon at the Westlake Village Yacht Club from 9 am to 1 pm that day.

We'll be using both the inside of the Yacht Club (next to Bocaccio's Restaurant) and their private patio on the lake front. By then we will have a new pastor to help lead the service, and we'll bring back as many of the folks who are important to the congregation's history as possible.


