We don't begin by naming our place in the kingdom or our good and bad deeds. No, we start by calling on the name of God as the first and primary actor in all of our existence. From that point we are off to the races being reminded of all the gracious and merciful acts God has accomplished which encourages our faithful response.

Rituals in liturgy bring us a theological order. God first, everything else next.

I encourage you to embrace your rituals as a way to provide order in our sometimes crazy lives.




