"We know love by this, that he laid down his life for us - and we ought to lay down our lives for one another. How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action." (1 John 3:16-18)

He is risen!

The story of Easter is at the very core of Christianity. Christ died on a cross and was raised to new life. Because of this, we know that God will raise us as well. Easter is a vision of things to come. Nothing can separate us from the love of God; grace is even stronger than death.

As wonderful as this is, however, the Bible does not end with the resurrection. It is followed with a call to action. 1 John says that, because Christ laid down his life for us, we ought to dedicate our lives to one another.

What does this mean? It means that we are called to help those who are in need. They are not to be neglected or forgotten. The Bible refers to our fellow human beings as "brothers and sisters." God has made us into a family, and we should treat one another as beloved siblings.

I find the final line in this passage particularly powerful. Love is about more than words or simple speech. True love requires action. This is not to suggest that our words do not matter; we have all experienced the power of speech. Unkind words can bring pain or harm. Words of support can inspire and bring compassion. But our ministry as Christians is to move beyond conversation into action. It is one thing to say "I love you," but it is another to make it tangible.

So let us heed the story of Easter. The resurrection is a promise of grace, but it is also a calling. We are to take up the cross and serve our neighbors.


