"The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. The Lord is good to all, and his compassion is over all that he has made." (Psalm 145:8-9, one of our readings for worship on August 6th)

God's love is abundant. The Book of Psalms is filled with images of grace. This little verse is a great example. Read it over once more. These words truly are something amazing. The goodness of God stretches to every corner of the earth. The Lord overflows with grace, compassion, and steadfast love. In just a few words, the author paints a vivid picture: God's love is something humongous.

This is so different from how the world normally works. We are quick to anger and slow to forgive. We seek vengeance, vindication, and violence. We long to see pain brought to the people we consider the "enemy." But God works differently. The grace of the Lord abounds above our imagination.

Psalm 145 speaks a word of comfort. God's compassion covers all of creation, including you. You are always loved. But this passage also speaks a word of challenge. We are not only loved by God, but we are called to share that love in return.

If we truly believe that creation is beloved, then we must treat it as such. This means loving our neighbor as ourselves. It means abounding with kindness even when it feels difficult. It means opening our hearts to care about those people who are normally excluded.

It can often feel like we live in a society that is more divided than ever. Sometimes it even feels as though we have begun to celebrate divisiveness as a virtue. But God has a different vision for the world and for you. God overflows with grace and asks you to do the same.

May you abound in compassion and make love known.

Recently we celebrated the life of Vega Wolf, a lovely person who had been part of the congregation since its beginnings in 1972. I had the pleasure of knowing Vega, and her husband John, since our family came to California in 2000.

Vega was a woman of great faith with a wonderful sense of humor. She drew people in and welcomed everyone. You never wondered where you stood with Vega, or what her opinion might be on something. She and John were married more than sixty years when he passed five years ago, and while their lives were not always easy, they had a lot of fun.

Vega loved people and animals, travel (especially to Hawaii) and was a wonderful teacher. She taught high school and owned and operated a preschool, and I think she was the most alive around young children and animals. The thing I learned about her that I hadn't known before was that in addition to rescuing dozens of cats and kittens, and the occasional dog or bird, she once housed a duck in one of their bathtubs for several months! That's definitely showing a special love for God's creation.

The broader thing I learned, or maybe re-learned from Vega's memorial service came from one of her daughters talking about what she'd learned from her mother. "When you tell someone you care about goodbye, always tell them you love them." We never know when we'll see someone for the last time. And I don't think anybody can hear that they're loved too many times. Please, remember this bit of wisdom and use it often. I know that I try to, at least once or twice a day.

LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF NEEDS OUR HELP

For more than 75 years, LWR has responded to war, disaster, and emergency by turning the compassion of kit makers like you into tangible items that meet urgent needs and offer glimpses of hope for families experiencing crisis.

The Social Justice Small Group is asking for donations to prepare personal hygiene kits for people in need throughout the world. Although a hygiene kit might seem like a drop of help in an ocean of need, these basic necessities might be impossible for families to find on their own in the wake of disaster.

Each kit contains the following: towel, bar of soap, toothbrush, nail clippers, comb, at a cost of approximately \$10 per kit including shipping. Toothpaste is added at the collection site. If you would like to donate, please indicate LWR on your check. A collection basket will be found in the narthex during the month of September.

The Social Justice Small Group will be purchasing the needed items and then will sponsor a kit making party after church on an upcoming Sunday in October. The number of kits we can provide will be decided by the amount of donations. Thank you in advance for your generosity!
