"O give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his steadfast love endures forever! Let Israel say, 'His steadfast love endures forever.'" (Psalm 118:1-2)

Lent is the perfect time to allow our faith to grow.

At New Hope, we are continuing to look at the book *Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations* by Robert Schnase. We are already on number three! Over the course of March, we'll be focusing on "intentional faith development." And there is no better time to develop our faith than these weeks before Easter.

Holy Week leads us up to the Easter holiday. It begins with Maundy Thursday on March 28th. This is the day when we remember the story of the Last Supper, and we celebrate it with communion. The word "maundy" is Latin for "command." In this case, it refers to Jesus' command for us to serve one another.

Good Friday is the next day on March 29th. We call it "good" in the sense that it is holy or sacred. During worship, we will be hearing the story of the cross. If you pay attention, you will notice that this service concludes without a formal ending. The story is intentionally left unfinished until the following Sunday.

Easter Sunday is then on March 31st. We rejoice in the story that Christ is risen. Because Christ had new life, we can trust that we will have new life as well.

You could sum up all of Holy Week with the verse above. God's love endures forever! Grace is stronger than the betrayal of the disciples after the Last Supper. It is greater than our sin. It is more powerful than death. The story of Easter is about an empty tomb. Jesus has conquered death. Nothing is bigger than God's love for us.

The times for our Holy Week services are as follows. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday will be done in cooperation with our friends at Shepherd of the Valley Lutheran Church in West Hills. Please note the location for each service:

I pray that we can sink into the story of Holy Week this year. May your faith grow!

Dear members and friends of New Hope,

Thank you for your patience and generosity while I took more than six week of leave while Joe started his cancer treatment. I cannot tell you how comforting it was to be able to focus on things at home without worrying about anything else. Of course I missed everybody, and I missed being in church to worship and lead worship. I'll be glad to get back to those things this month.

As I write this late in February, Joe is 2/3 of the way through his second treatment cycle. After he finishes four of those, he'll have tests to see whether he can stop there and go on maintenance, or whether he will need two more rounds of treatment. The good news is that he is apparently what his oncologist calls a "super-responder" to the chemo drugs. This means that they found the right combination the first time to have Joe's body respond in the best way possible. His pain is a great deal less, and he's stopped losing weight and actually gains a little bit some weeks. He won't be joining us at church right away yet; his immune system still needs as much protection as possible.

Your cards, letters, and food have been gifts from God. Not having to worry about what we would eat after making the round trip to Ventura on treatment days (that's a story for another time) was wonderful, and the cards were real spirit-lifters. I look forward to seeing you all in person on Sunday, March 3rd.


